Brian opened the meeting at 7:07pm

Leslie read the minutes from the August General Meeting.

Rose reported that there are currently 323 paid members. The current balance of the checking account is \$16,718.63. The grass cutting company has not invoiced since June and Rose is trying to get that paid and up-to-date.

OLD BUSINESS –

Regarding the house on Winterhaven that had been boarded up and in disrepair...this has been taken care of by the owner.

The last house on Summerfield on the left before heading into Four Seasons II is in foreclosure. The volunteers who cut the area between Four Seasons and Four Seasons II have been cutting grass. The mortgage company has no interest in putting money into the property. Neighbors have been trying to keep the house in a respectable state. THANK YOU VOLUNTEERS.

NEW BUSINESS –

Street lights – A resident on Summerfield close to Beargrass Creek asked that street lights be installed in that area because it is so dark. Brian will check into.

Brian will ask the grass cutting company to also bid the area going into Four Seasons II for next year.
