Les Allen opened the meeting at 7:03

Jackie read the minutes from the May meeting, a motion to accept the minutes, seconded and approved.

Judy read the Treasurers report, she reported that our street light bill has increased a little, and the last bill was \$704.32. As of the end of August we had a bank balance of \$17,269.62. She also reported that more dues came in, currently we have 321 paid members. That is an all time record for us. A motion was made to accept the financial report, it was seconded and approved.

OLD BUSINESS -

Les reported that he contacted Councilman Kramer's office regarding the MSD area entering into Four Seasons II. MSD cleaned up some of the overgrown brush and trees. Two area residents then came in to mow and trim the grass areas.

Les also reported that he had contacted Metro Public Works about the need for speed limit signs. They surveyed the area and determined that we did and installed some. They will also install some on Petty Jay. One resident was upset due to the location and removed the sign. It has since been placed in a different location. Les reminded everyone that if they have an issue with a traffic control sign, not to remove it but take it up with Metro Public Works.

This year's yard sale was successful, David Lynch sponsored this year's sale and paid for the cost of the newspaper ad and placed the signs. He is looking for another sponsor to share the cost with him next year.

NEW BUSINESS

Waste Manage rates are increasing, this is the first rate increase since 2006. The new rates are Weekly Trash-\$12.24 per month, Weekly Recycling-\$5.35 per month, and Weekly Yard Waste-\$5.35 per month. New rates are in effect from July 1, 2015, through June 30, 2017.

Speed Humps-no word on speed humps for Summerfield. One resident showed a picture of a speed limit sign in Houston Acres that clock the speed limit and flashes if over 25 MPH. He wondered if that might be a better alternative than speed humps.

Some residents are walking dogs without a leash which is against the law, also some residents are not cleaning up after their pets. We will put that in the newsletter and on our website.

Elections are coming up in November. We need a President and Treasurer which are both 2 year terms. We also need a Vice President since our current VP is moving and needs to resign in December. David Lynch is working on filling those positions. If you can help please contact David. We had one person who volunteered to be on the ballot for Treasurer.

Pat Sims of Winterhaven Road spoke about her son being hit by a van while riding his bicycle near Eastside Drive and Chimney Rock Road.
