GENERAL MEETING MINUTERS 8/15/2017

Judy opened the meeting at 7:00

The May General meeting minutes were not read.

Judy welcomed everyone and told everyone that she was the Vice-President but filling the balance of Brian Noe's term as President. She also announced that she agreed to run for President in 2018. Judy also told everyone we were in need of a Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer.

Les stated that he would work on the election, we need to keep the 'At Large' positions as called for in the by-laws. They represent their area, and while they are no longer need to deliver newsletters they still needed to report the address so a welcome letter can be sent, or welcome the new resident. They also may be needed to deliver newsletters to those without electronic access to the web.

Summerfield Drive speed bumps project was brought up. A group of neighbors headed by Mary Lou Reed worked very hard with Metro Public Works. A traffic and speed study was conducted and it was determined that Summerfield Drive needed six speed bumps. The group needed 70% of the residents on Summerfield to be in favor of speed bumps, the group got nearly 85%. There was some discussion on the subject. Councilman Kramer would pay for half of the project the neighborhood association would pay the other half. The total cost would be \$13,300.00, our part would be half or \$6,650.00.

The financial report was then read by Rose Goodgine, She reported that we have 318 members. She also reported our bank balance as of 8/15/17 was \$18,462.72, she estimated that if we pay our ongoing expenses, and the speed bumps our balance at the end of the year would be approximately \$6,875.72. A motion was then made to pay our half of the speed bumps of \$6,650; it was seconded and approved.

One member stated we need volunteers to go door to door to those who have not paid dues explain what FSNA is about and encourage them to join. Some residents may not know that that FSNA exists and what we do, especially new residents. A small group agreed to work on that project.

One person volunteered to take the balance of Judy Buckner term as Vice-President.

A suggestion was made that we consider raising dues and that our \$35.00 is a bargain. She also thought we should get some estimates on snow removal and see if that was an option during heavier snows. No action taken.
