New Streetlight

The proposed new streetlight for Spring Breeze Ct is being reconsidered. Funding for this light was approved when FSNA installed the last three streetlights. Due to right-ofway issues, the project was cancelled. LG&E has surveyed the area again and it is feasible, final approval is pending. Streetlights cost approximately \$250 per year.

How the Four Seasons Neighborhood Association Got Started

When Four Seasons II was being developed, there was an intention to have a homeowner's association. The developer, Elam Huddleston did not set up the development correctly and he neglected to pay the streetlight bills.

Then one day, all the lights in the subdivision went dark. To overcome this issue, several neighbors volunteered to collect money to pay the streetlight bill. They also contacted Harry Borders, attorney, asking for a homeowner's association to take over. Due to the incorrect development, Harry worked with Councilman Kevin Kramer and others to turn Four Seasons and Four Seasons II neighborhoods into an official neighborhood association.

Neighborhood associations are volunteer based. The dues cover costs of streetlights, installation of speed bumps, cleanup efforts, discounted services and more.

Reminder About Short Term Rentals

Short-term rentals such as VRBO and Airbnb are not allowed in Four Seasons and other areas of Louisville without a Conditional Use Permit, CPU. There are strict guidelines on Metro Louisville website regarding this.

Waste Management

WM is now using a grapple arm and single truck driver to pick-up trash. This means:

- Wheels and handle need to be placed toward your house and 4 feet away from mailboxes or other objects (cars included)
- Lid must be closed
- All trash inside the totter

Also, WM encourages customers to register with WM online or download the app.

Pick up schedule: trash is picked up every Wednesday, yard waste is every other Thursday, and recycling is every other Friday.
